Lt Col James W. Lambertsen is the Commander, Detachment 10, Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps, The University of Alabama, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. In this capacity, he is responsible for recruiting and overseeing the preparation of more than 100 officer candidates at The University of Alabama and three additional crosstown colleges: Marion Military Institute, Stillman College, and the University of West Alabama. Colonel Lambertsen also serves as the Professor of Aerospace Studies and instructs cadets on the Foundation of the United States Air Force, Leadership Studies, and National Security Affairs.

Colonel Lambertsen earned his commission in 2006 through the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps upon graduating from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, Daytona Beach, Fl. He attained a master's degree in Aeronautical Science from Embry Riddle in 2011 and

a master's degree in Military Operational Art & Science from Air Command and Staff College in 2019.



Colonel Lambertsen is a senior pilot with more than 3,500 hours flying airlift and special operations aircraft. He has completed seven combat deployments in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM, Operation IRAQI FREEDOM, and Operation INHERENT RESOLVE. As an additional duty, Colonel Lambertsen served as a Presidential Advance Agent, coordinating the arrival and departure of Air Force One to locations world-wide. Most recently, Colonel Lambertsen served on Air University Staff managing the Air University Fellows Intermediate Developmental Education Program.
